

### Dark Hendrickson Cripple

This fly is a good imitation of a Hendrickson which has suffered damage as it attempted to hatch and can be a good alternative as the hatch progresses.

- Hook: # 14 standard dry fly hook of your choice-with bard removed/flattened
- Thread: # 70 tan
- Shuck: May fly brown zelon
- Abdomen: 4-5 pheasant tail fibers
- Wing: White Para Post material or White antron
- Thorax: Light dubbing..brown
- Hackle: Blue Dun

- Place Hook in vice.
- Wrap hook with thread from hook eye to where bend in hook begins.
- Tie in shuck material, using hook gap for length.
- Tie in pheasant tail material. Coat thread with cement and wrap fibers forward to 1/3 point behind the hook eye and tie off.
- Tie in wing material, slanted forward over hook eye, wrap thread around front of wing to stand it up.
- attach hackle and wrap 2-3 times behind wing and 1-2 wraps in front of wing. Tie off hackle and head
- if fly. Cement head.
- Trim hackle even with hook point and trim fly wing to appropriate length.

This fly floats well after applying floatant and is generally easy to see due to the upright white color. Light dun and black antron can be substituted.
